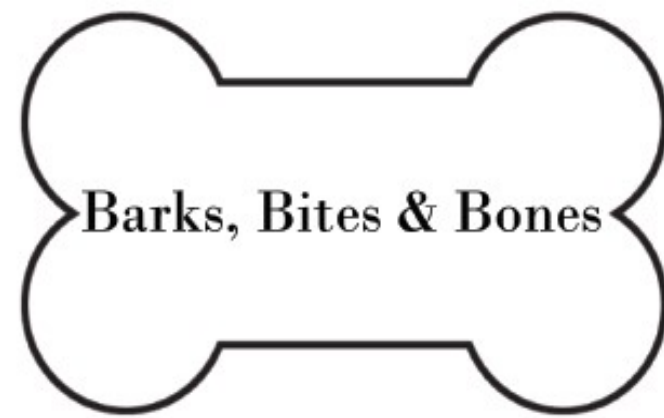

## Pet Schedules
